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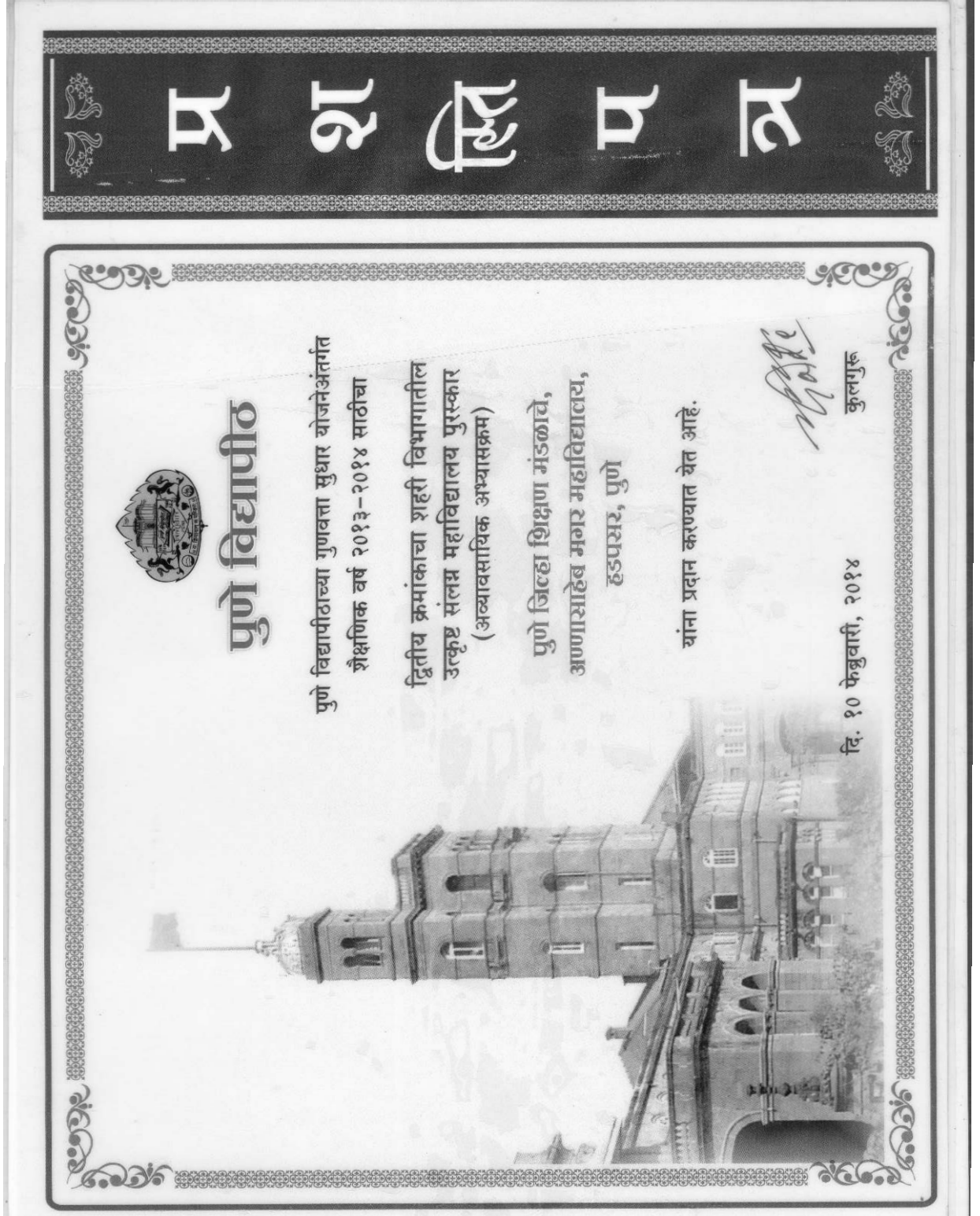

Pune District Education Association Pune (PDEA), the trust under the aegis of which this college is run, is a renowned organization in the field of education with a proven standing of 75 years. The trust was founded in 1941 by an educationalist and social reformer Late. Shri. Baburaoji Gholap with the mission of eradicating the social evil "Illiteracy" which was prevalent among the children and women of Pune district. Initially with the help of other social reformers like Late. Shri. Annasaheb Gopal Awate, he started primary schools in remote parts of Pune District which later graduated into Secondary school & Junior colleges. In early 70's realizing the need for higher education, colleges were established in remote parts of Pune district. Since the philosophy of the founders was 'uplift of the rural masses through education', the trust realized its mission as "Bahujan Hitay Bahujan Sukhay" which is still the motto of the Trust. In 1990's the President of the Trust late. Prof. Ramkrishna More, realizing the need for technical higher education, started a number of technical institutions and added to the number of already existing degree colleges. Today the trust has 7 Preprimary Schools , 12 Primary Schools , 53 Secondary Schools , 23 higher

Eligibility Conditions

Students migrating from other universities/boards either from the state of Maharashtra or from outside Maharashtra state will be admitted to the college on production of an Eligibility Certificate (or a provisional admission certificate, prior to the final Eligibility Certificate) from the SPPU.

For this purpose the students will have to apply to the SPPU in the prescribed form of Eligibility Certificate along with the following certificates in original (and a Xerox copy thereof).

1. Passing Certificate
2. Statement of Marks and
3. Migration Certificate from previous University / Board &

- i) Attendance Certificate
- ii) Character Certificate from the Principal of the previous college
- iii) The students have to pay the eligibility certificate fees.

In all the cases the fees paid shall not be refunded (Ref. P. U. Circular no. 82 of 1978)

The responsibility of obtaining an Eligibility Certificate from the Pune University lies with the students themselves. The college will however provide necessary guidance.

Eligibility :

All the students seeking admission to M.A. / M.Com. M.Sc. Part I of all faculties are required to complete the eligibility formalities on or before due date positively in the interest of confirming their admission.

Those who fail to comply with this procedure for one reason or the other are to note that their admissions would automatically stand cancelled for which the college authorities shall not be responsible whatsoever.

Documents required for admission :

- * Original Graduation Mark sheet with 2 Xerox copies.
- * Original College Transfer Certificate with one Xerox copy.
- * Cast certificate (if applicable)
- * Migration certificate for students from other than SPPU.
- * 2 Passport Photos.

Attendance and Discipline

1. The students are advised to refer regularly to all notices displayed at various places on the notice board. Ignorance of the same shall not be entertained as an excuse.
2. A student must always possess his/her I Card which must be produced on demand by the College Authorities.
3. The students shall attend lectures, Practicals, Tutorials, Unit Tests and Examinations and shall keep their guardians informed of progress
4. The students should note that they will not be permitted to appear for the University examinations if they fail to satisfy the College Authorities on any of the following grounds :
 - a. At least 75% attendance at Lectures / Practicals.
 - b. At least 75% at NCC parades / NSS work as prescribed.
 - c. Attendance and performance at the college examinations / tutorials.
 - d. Good behaviour and observance of discipline in the college premises.
 - e. Obedience of the instructions of teachers / staff and the other college authorities.
 - f. Payment of college fees as instructed.
5. Students should note that smoking, tobacco chewing, spitting etc. is strictly prohibited within the college campus.
6. Students must deactivate Mobile or Cell Phones in the classrooms or laboratories or during academic activities.

Rules of Discipline

- 1) Students must observe strict discipline in the college premises / campus and should not disturb the College / teaching & administration in any manner whatsoever.
- 2) Students should take proper care of the college property, and help in **keeping the premises clean, neat and tidy**. Any damage, whatsoever done will be treated as a **serious breach of discipline** and the cost of the damage(s) will be recovered from students.
- 3) No Society or Association shall be formed by the students in the College and no person should be invited to attend and address any meeting without prior permission of the PRINCIPAL.
- 4) Students should be regular and punctual in attending their lectures, practicals, tutorials and tests. Students should refrain from remaining absent, however if a student desires to remain absent for any genuine reason(s) prior permission of the Principal / H.O.D. should be taken.
- 5) Students should not loiter about and sit near class rooms, laboratories, in varandahs, stair case, cycle stand and play ground, that may cause disturbance to the periods / classes which are going on. They should either go to the library or leave the college premises, in case there are no lectures or practicals.
- 6) Annual Social Gathering and any similar programmes / functions which are likely to disrupt the academic atmosphere on the college campus shall not be permitted.
- 7) Students should note that smoking, tobacco chewing, spitting etc. is strictly prohibited in the college campus.
- 8) **Any one found indulging in any ragging within or outside the college shall be instantly expelled from the college.**

Government Scholarships and Concessions

Various scholarships like the Govt. of India National Scholarships are awarded on the basis of merit at the S.S.C. examination. Scholarships & Freeships granted by the state govt. like the B.C., E.B.C. are available to deserving students of the college on fulfillment of the govt. conditions in this regards.

Freeships to wards of Primary, Secondary & Higher Secondary teachers and scholarships & concessions to wards of freedom fighters are available on fulfillment of the conditions in this regards. These conditions will be notified on the college notice board.

A student belonging to economically backward class will be admitted to the college F.Y., S.Y., T.Y. classes on payments of caution money, laboratory deposit (in case of Science student), library deposit & other miscellaneous fees.

The tuition fee will be refunded to a F.Y. student after E.B.C. freeship is sanctioned by the Govt. & after the amount of fees is received by the college. The student then need not pay further tuition fees if his/her income or about any condition of the ward.

For this purpose the guardian of the concerned student will have to give a declaration, that the student belongs to the economically backward class category. Scheduled Caste & Scheduled Tribes student will however be admitted only on the payment of caution money, laboratory deposits (In case of Science student) library deposits & other non refundable fees after producing the necessary certificate of caste.

The E.B.C. freeships like other fee concessions, scholarships etc. are subject to good conduct, regular attendance & satisfactory progress. Failure to satisfy these conditions will result in forfeiture of the E.B.C. freeship & student will have to pay the college fees entirely of him/her self.

Verification & Revaluation :-

A candidate may apply for Verification / Revaluation by paying the necessary fees of the University. The Verification & Revaluation will be done by the University as per the ordinance framed in the behalf. This provision is applicable to the students appearing for Annual Examination.

Govt. Post S.S.C. Scholarships to B.C. Students :

The scheme of grant of Government of India Scholarship for the Backward Class student/ Scheduled Caste / Nomadic Tribes/ Vimukta jaties / Nav Buddhas & Scheduled Tribes

outside specified area for the post S.S.C. courses is implemented by the Director of Social Welfare, M.S. , Pune. All the backward class students undertaking approved post S.S.C. courses are considered eligible for the Government of India scholarships subject to the Rules & Regulations of the Scheme.

Only those candidates who belong to S.C. & S.T. as specified in relation to the State / Union Territory i.e. are permanently settled & those who have passed the matriculation or higher secondary or any other examination of a recognized University or Board of Secondary education will be held eligible.

Conditions of Eligibility :

- i) Candidates who are studying in the stream of education in a different subject will not be eligible.
- ii) Candidates who have completed their educational career in one profession line like L.L.B., B.Ed. will not be eligible.
- iii) Students studying in class XI of higher secondary school courses of the multipurpose High School will not be eligible being continuous School courses. However, in case where 10th class examination of such courses is treated as equivalent to S.S.C. and students who after passing 10th class join other courses, such students will be treated as post S.S.C. students & will be eligible for the award of scholarships.
- iv) Candidates who after failing or passing the undergraduate, graduate, post graduate examination in Arts / Science / Commerce join any recognized professional or technical certificate/ diploma/degree course will be awarded scholarships, if otherwise found eligible. No subsequent failure will be condemned & no further change in the course will be allowed.
- v) Students who are in full time employment will not be eligible for scholarship.
- vi) Only two children of the same parents/ guardian will be entitled to receive scholarship.
- vii) A scholarship holder under this scheme will not hold any other scholarship/stipend.

Scholarships Eligibility Conditions Chart

**PROCEDURE FOR SUBMISSION OF FORM FOR
GOVERNMENT OF INDIA SCHOLARSHIP**

All Backward Class students and students coming under the lower income group category should apply for the Government of India Scholarship in the prescribed form through their respective college in the month of July only. The application form will be made available to them at the time of their admission. All the students should be vigilant enough to fill in the form, complete, in all respects as any incorrect, false information is act to disqualify them for the above Scholarship. The students having a gap in their education should invariably file a court affidavit declaring as to what they were doing during intervening period.

The students in M.A. Part I / M.Com Part I / will be treated as fresh candidates for the purpose of scholarship and as such they are required to apply of scholarship in them prescribed fresh application forms. The Students who were in receipt of Government of India scholarship last year and have passed the annual examination are also required to fill in the prescribed renewal application forms.

1) Various printed forms for scholarships are available in college office.

2) Attested copies of mark list, school leaving certificate, cast certificate are required.

3) Minimum 75% attendance is required to sanction scholarship, freeship.

4) Students have to submit new application form for every year within 30 days after taking admission otherwise complete amount of fees shall have to be paid.

General Conditions :-

Admission and Eligibility

All admissions are made as per the rules and regulation of the Savitribai Phule University, Pune.

1. An application for admission to the college will have to be made in a printed application form by all students (including those who were in this college during the previous year.)

SPPU Circular No. 170 of 2009

It is hereby notified for information of all concerned that in view of the Judgement and Order dated 11.2.2009 of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in the matter of the University of Kerala V/s the Council Of Principals of College in Kerala and Others, the following measures shall be taken to prevent ragging in the Colleges / Institutions.

1. In the prospectus of the Higher Educational Institutions, it should be mentioned that if any incident of ragging comes to the notice of the authority concerned, the accused student will be given an opportunity to explain and if his explanation is not satisfactory, the authority would expel him from the institution. The number of cases of ragging and punishment given by the educational institutions in the previous academic year should also be incorporated in the prospectus of Higher Educational Institutions.
2. Anti ragging committees and squads to check ragging should be constituted and the names and telephone numbers of officials to be contacted by the students in case of ragging, should also be published.
3. Counseling sessions and orientation courses for senior and fresh students should be conducted.
4. All institutions should do whatever they can by ensuring punishment to the students found guilty of ragging, giving wide publicity to such punishments to act as a deterrent, strict enforcement of the various measures for preventing ragging.
5. Appropriate messages regarding "zero tolerance" towards ragging should be incorporated in admission notices /advertisements.

Rules and Regulation for the Credit and Semester Session in Post Graduate Centres of the affiliated colleges of the SPPU w. e. f. Academic Year 2019 – 2020

Preamble

In Pursuance of the decision to implement credit System at the Post Graduate level and ensure continues assessment, the SPPU has decided to implement the Credit and Semester System (CSS) in all its affiliated colleges and recognised institutions where post graduate courses are conducted.

1) General Admission

- 1.1 These rules and regulation shall in applicable to the conduct of CSS initially for three years i.e., for students admitted in the academic year 2013 – 2014 onwards.
- 1.2 In 2015 -2016, Hon VC will appoint an appropriate committee to review and revise these rules.
- 1.3 There shall coordination Committee at University level for CSS, Director, BCUD shall be the Chairperson of the Coordination Committee. The coordination Committee shall be as follows :
 - 1) Director, BCUD – Chairman.
 - 2) Three members of Management Council nominated by the Management Council.
 - 3) Deans of all faculties.
 - 4) Two experts nominated by Hon. Vice Chancellor.

This Committee shall take all decisions arising out of these rules and regarding the implementation of CSS at PG Centres.

2) Conduct of the Credit and Semester System in PG Centers.

- 2.1 The post-graduate degree will be student who obtain a total Credit as follows

* - applicable where the course duration is one year, the course shall consist of minimum 40 credits, Except practical credits wherever applicable, students may be allowed to obtain less course per semester on a condition that they complete the degree in a maximum of four years. This faculty will be available subject to availability of concerned courses in a given semester and with a maximum variation of 25 % credits (in case of fresh credit) per semester.

- 2.2 The proportion Laboratory course shall be around 40% total credits. Project work, if included, shall consist if NOT more than 10% of total credits in Science and 05 % of total credit in non-Science degree programmes.
- 2.3 Once credit will be equivalent to 15 clock hours of teacher-student contact per semester. There will be no midway change allowed from CSS in non-credit (external) system or vice versa.
- 2.4 Any post graduate teacher in a given subject shall be affiliated to only ONE post graduate Centre at any given time and for only one subject.
- 2.5 For the routine conduct of the CSS, dean of concerned faculty shall be the Chairperson. The constitution of faculty-wise committee's shall be as follows.
 - 1) Deans of Concerned Faculty –Chairman.
 - 2) Two HoD's of Post-Graduate Centres from the faculty nominated by Hon. Vice-Chancellor.
 - 3) One HoD/ Professor/ Subject expert from Post Graduate Department of the University nominated by Hon Vice Chancellor.
 - 4) Director, BCUD Coordinator.
- 2.6 Among the total number of credits required to be completed for Post Graduate degree course (64/100 credit) students have to opt for minimum 75% credits from parent Department and remaining 25 % can be opted from either parent Department or other Department / Centres / Faculty. In additional to that, students have to obtain compulsory credit over and above.

3 Examination Rules

- 3.1 Assessment shall consist of a) I-continuous assessment and b) end-semester assessment. Both shall have an equal weightage of 50% each.
- 3.2 The teacher concerned shall announce the units for which each in-semester assessment will take place. However, the end-semester assessment shall cover the entire syllabus prescribed for the course.
- 3.3 An in-semester assessment of 50% marks should be continuous and at least two tests should be conducted for full of 4 credits and a teacher must select a variety of procedures for examination such as :
 - a) Written Test and / or Mid Term Test (not more than one or two for each course)
 - b) Term Paper,

- c) Journal / Lecture / Library notes;
- d) Seminar presentation
- e) Short Quizzes;
- f) Assignments;
- g) Extension work;
- h) An Open Book Test
(with concerned teacher decided what books are to be allowed for this purpose).
- i) Min Research Project by individual student or group of students.

The concerned teacher in consultation with the Head of the PG Department shall decide the nature of question for the Unit test.

- 3.4 Semester end examination for remaining 50% marks will be conducted by the University of Pune.
- 3.5 The student has to obtain 40 % marks in the combined examination of in Semester assessment and Semester-End assessment with a minimum passing of 30 % in both these separately.
- 3.6 To pass the degree course, a student shall have to get minimum aggregate 40 % marks (E and above on grade point scale) in each course.
- 3.7 If a student misses an internal assessment examination he / she will have a second chance will the permission of the Principal in consultation with the concerned teacher. Such a second chance shall not be the right of the students.
- 3.8 Internal marks will not change. A student cannot repeat Internal Assessment. In case she / he wants to repeat internal assessment she / he can do so only by registering for the said course during the 5th / 6th semester and onwards and up to 8th Semester.
- 3.9 Students who have failed semester-end my examination may reappear for the semester-end examination only twice in subsequent period. The student will be finally declared as failed if she / he does not pass in all credits within a total period of four years. After that, such student will have to seek fresh admission as per the admission rules prevailing at that time.
- 3.10 A student cannot register for the third semester, if she/he fails to complete 50% credits of the total credits expected to be ordinarily completed within two semesters.
- 3.11 There shall be Revaluation of the answer scripts of Semester-End examination but not of internal assessment papers.
- 3.12 While marks will be given for all examinations, they will be converted into grades. The semester end grade sheets will have only grades and final grade sheets and transcripts shall have grade points average and total percentage of marks (up to two decimal points). The final grade sheet will also indicate the PG Center to which the candidate belongs.

4 Assessment and Grade point average :

- 4.1 The system of evaluation will be as follows : Each assignment/test will be evaluated in terms of grades. The grades for separate assignments and the final (semester-end) examination will be added together and then converted into a grade and later a grade point average. Results will be declared for each semester and the final examination will give total grades and grade point average.

- 4.6 The formula for GPA will be based on weighted Average. The final GPA will not be printed
- 4.7 'B' Grade is equivalent to atleast 55% of the marks as per circular No. UGC-[1298]/[4619]UNI-4 dated December 11, 1999.
- 4.8 A seven point grade system [guided by the Government of Maharashtra Resolution No. NGV-1298/[4619]/UNI.4 Dated December 11, 1999 and the University will be followed uniformly for Science, Arts Mental, Moral and Social Sciences. The corresponding grade table is detailed in ii.14 above.

- 4.9 If the GPA is higher than the indicated upper limit in the three decimal digit, than the student be awarded higher final grade (e.g. a student getting GPA of 4.492 may be awarded 'A')
- 4.10 There will be only final compilation and moderation at GPA (Final) level done at the Department. While declaring the result, the existing relevant ordinances are applicable. There is also provision for verification ad revaluation in case of verification, the existing rules will be applicable. The revaluation result will be adopted If there is a change of at least 10% mars and in the grade of the course.
- 4.11 For grade improvement a student must reappear for semester-end examination for a minimum 30 credits in case Sciences 20 credits in case of faculties either than Science and 2 credits in case of one year degree programmes. These courses will b from the parent department. Grade Improvement Programme will be implemented a the end of the academic year. A student can opt for the grade Improvement of the nest academic year after passing the M.A. // M. Sc examination ad within two years completion of M.A. / M. Sc and only once.
- 4.12 The description for each of the grade will be as follows :
